Our Recycling Campaign	Saturday 12th March 11 a.m. Photo shoot in Shrewsbury to raise awareness of the Government's plans to set new goals for waste policy in England. The coalition is committed to work towards a zero waste economy and the outcome of the Waste Review is in May. FoE is pushing to reduce the amount of waste we bury and burn. Waste policy comes under DEFRA but there is anti-recycling interference from Department for Communities and Local Government. FoE is aiming to elevate waste and recycling from the departmental, policy level issue to a Cabinet Office issue. So David Cameron is our target. The strategy emphasises that the most people want to throw away less rubbish and do more and better recycling. The goal for our campaign is to halve household 'black bag' waste by 2020. The first step is to raise awareness around the national day of action on 19 th March.	It is essential for the success of the campaign that local groups get as much coverage in their local media as possible. We will be asking local residents for their views about recycling and it would be good if anyone of our members could get letters in the press to highlight this issue. Sample letters available.
